Governor's Proclamation



WHEREAS, on July 26, 1990, the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) was signed into law, establishing a national mandate to eliminate discrimination against individuals with disabilities; and

WHEREAS, the ADA affirms the dignity, worth, and equal rights of more than one in four Americans with disabilities, including thousands of Montanans, by ensuring full participation in community, independent living, and economic self-sufficiency; and

WHEREAS, the ADA has removed barriers and expanded opportunities in education, employment, transportation, public accommodation, government services, and telecommunications; and

WHEREAS, Montana is committed to protecting the civil rights of individuals with disabilities and ensuring that every Montanan has equal access to opportunities that support independence, success, and community participation; and

WHEREAS, state and local partners continue to support the promise of the ADA by promoting accessibility and equal opportunity across Montana;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Greg Gianforte, Governor of the State of Montana, do hereby proclaim July 26, 2025

AMERICANS WITH DISABILITIES ACT 35TH ANNIVERSARY DAY

to recognize the ADA's work to advance access and opportunity for people with disabilities.
