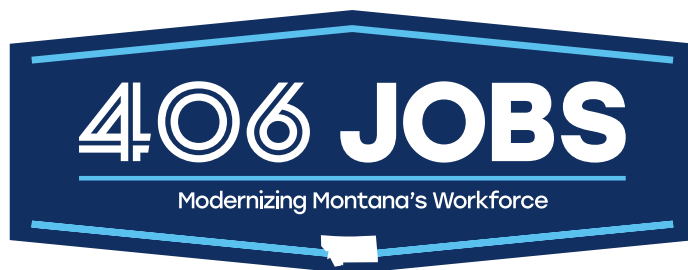


# Year One Work Plan
