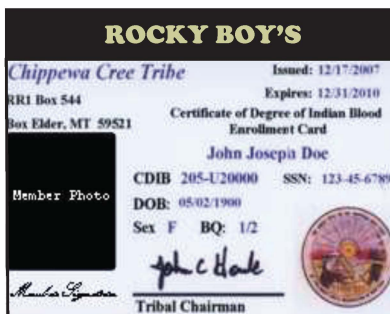
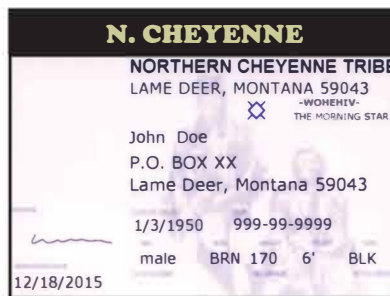
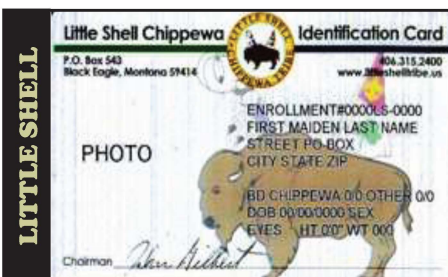
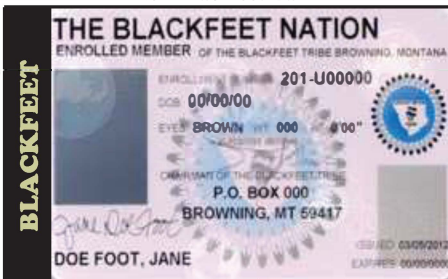
As of **October 1, 2007**, Montana law requires that a tribal identification card be treated the same as a Montana identification card for identification purposes, including but not limited to:

- ◆ purchasing alcohol and tobacco products and registering for the purchase of a keg of beer
- ◆ obtaining a conservation, hunting, or fishing license
- ◆ recording titles to motor vehicles, trailers, semi-trailers, pole trailers, travel trailers, campers, motorboats, personal watercraft, sailboats, snowmobiles, and off-highway vehicles
- ◆ applying for a concealed weapon permit

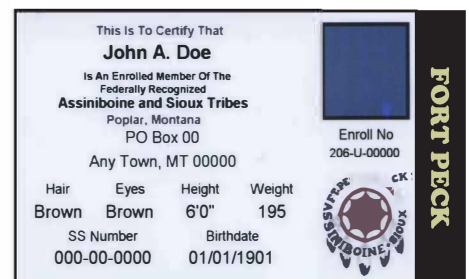
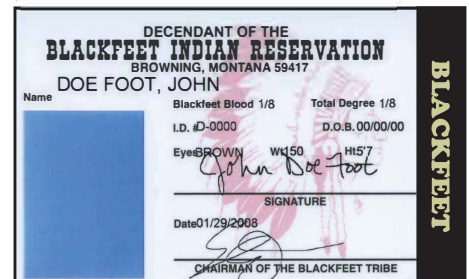
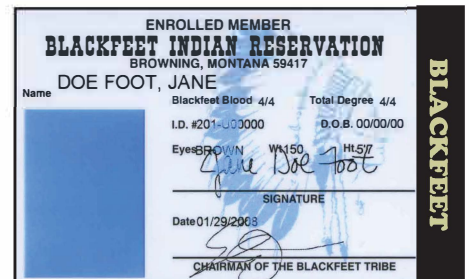
When verifying a tribal identification for a purchase, look for the birthdate and name. Tribal identifications will sometimes bear a picture of the person when they were much younger. If you are unable to determine that the person standing in front of you is the person on the identification, you may ask for a secondary form of identification. Some tribal identifications will have this information located on the back of the card.
